The above list contains some common words in Latin, which you'll see often during our lessons. It is always important to keep learning and memorising new words when you're studying a language, so which techniques work best for you?

<u>Task 1</u>. Learning Vocabulary. This week, have a go at using the following ideas for learning the words in the above list:

### A. Look, Cover, Write, Check

- 1. Look at the words carefully and try to think of links.
- 2. Cover the English meanings up and write down what you think the Latin words mean.
- 3. Check your answers to see how well you're doing.
- 4. Repeat this process until you get all the words right.

## **B.** Imaginative Sentences

Create an imaginative sentence to help you remember the Latin word.

For example: "We want the slave to serve us" (servus = slave).

#### **C. Picture Words**

Can you think of a way of turning the word into a picture that shows its meaning? For example: you could draw a roof and chimney over the word "villa".
